**Incoming and outgoing mobility with Romania
funded by the Erasmus program.**



West University of Timisoara (WUT) selected us as one of the target universities for three academic visits in 2023 under the Erasmus+ Program (Key Action 1 Mobility) funded by the European Commission.

Erasmus+ KA107 provides opportunities for students to undertake academic training and for staff to teach or train in higher education institutions (HEIs) outside Europe and vice versa.

On February 8 and 9, Iris Alexandra Mihai, Ph.D., from the West University of Timisoara in Romania, delivered a lecture on "Mindful Leadership" and spent a week with students and academics at the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences. In turn, the Catholic University of Colombia also obtained an outgoing

mobility in which Professor Felipe Diaz Lombana had the opportunity to visit West University of Timisoara from October 9th to October 13th. During his visit, professor Diaz Lombana delivered a conference on environmental care of the Amazon, and gathered with students, professors and researchers.

Similarly, Roxana Diaconescu, Director of Global Cooperation and Cristina Cojocaru, head of the Erasmus+ office of the West University of Timișoara, were also at our university from March 6 to 7 thanks to an Erasmus+ Staff Mobility grant, which gave them the opportunity to exchange internationalization projects with our institution.

This mobility is the result of several years of work with this university, with which we have achieved funding for outgoing mobility of 1 staff member (2018), mobility of 1 exchange scholarship student (2018) and the nomination to be part of the Unita Network (2021).



Institutional engagement on Community-Centered Solutions: Addressing Vulnerability

With the aim of addressing the realities and needs of the community,



the institution has been participating in several community outreach projects, with the support of the Social Responsibility Coordination. One of these initiatives is the project entitled "Villa Nueva Alta Community Hall", developed by a group of three students and two professors of our Architecture Program, carried out in partnership with the American NGO Building Trust Americas.

The main objective of this project is "to establish a collaborative scenario aimed at developing practical experiences of neighborhood improvement, with community participation in Ciudad dela Sucre in the municipality of Soacha, which include strategies that respond to the new housing demands of health, productivity and food security, among others, which are evident with the crisis generated by the pandemic of Covid-19".

The development of this project has a very positive impact on the quality of life of the inhabitants of the Nueva Alta neighborhood, strengthening its local identity, fostering social cohesion and promoting the sense of belonging. In addition to that, in students involved, the project encourages several skills such as empathy, communication, teamwork, leadership, critical thinking, resilience and adaptability and community engagement, preparing them to become responsible global citizens.

Universidad Católica de Colombia comprometida con los Objetivos de Desarrollo Sostenible y la Agenda 2030.

La Universidad en su compromiso con la promoción de la sostenibilidad global, viene adelantando diferentes iniciativas desde sus procesos misionales, generando en su comunidad académica una conciencia global que le permita afrontar los desafíos del mundo actual. Desde el año 2023, nuestra institución se vinculó a la

organizada conjuntamente con la Universidad el Bosque, la Universidad Antonio Nariño, la Fundación Universitaria Juan N. Corpas, la Universidad de América y la Universidad Católica de Colombia, con el objetivo de promover en los participantes la comprensión y el análisis de los Objetivos de Desarrollo Sostenible. Esta Cátedra duró 17 semanas, con dos sesiones semanales en modalidad sincrónica y en virtud de las cuales hubo 691 participantes, 95 de la Universidad Católica de Colombia, incluyendo estudiantes (38), profesores (12), funcionarios administrativos (8) y egresados (37).

Esta cátedra contó con la participación de académicos de las instituciones participantes y expertos

en cada ODS, provenientes de organizaciones multilaterales (OIM, Sustainable Energy For all de las Naciones Unidas) y empresas en Francia (Asociación Internacional de Universidades), Estados Unidos (Henry Ford System, Bristol Myers Squibb, Ecosynapsis, US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), Portugal (CIIMAR), México (CIESAS Ciudad de México), Chile (Ingeniería Sin Fronteras (ISF), Clio Consulting) y Colombia (BIOSFERA - Think Tank, AEI Spaces, South Pole-Universidad de los Andes, y Plan Aire de la secretaría Distrital de Ambiente de Bogotá), generando una mejor comprensión del ODS en el sector real.

Universidad Católica de Colombia receives recognition in France by European consortium!



Our Institution has achieved recognition in the category of educational research and innovation in the GEMINAE awards, the ceremony was held in September 2023 at l'Université de Pau et des Pays de l'Adour in France.

These awards are developed by UNITA, an alliance of six comprehensive research universities from five European countries Universidade de Beira Interior (Portugal), Universidade de Zaragoza (Spain), Université de

Pau et des Pays de l'Adour (France), Université Savoie Mont Blanc (France), Università di Torino (Italy), and Universitatea de Vest din Timisoara (Romania).

This is a consortium financed by the European Commission to which the Universidad Católica de Colombia belongs with more than thirty institutions around the world.

The GEMINAE incentives highlight pioneering practices and initiatives that contribute to more effective and dynamic universities in an increasingly globalized and connected higher education system. Projects from the University of Rosario (Colombia), Universidad Nacional de Cuyo (Argentina), Universidad Autónoma de San Luis Potosí (Mexico) and Universidad Nacional de la Plata (Argentina) were also recognized.

PAIIES was selected as one of the best practices that promotes comprehensive internationalization strategies in higher education. It is a project led by the Catholic University of Colombia, the Catholic

University of Manizales and the Catholic University of Maule (Chile), which seeks to provide administrative staff with intercultural competencies and global citizenship, thus contributing to the development of human talent and internationalization processes.

How was this project developed?

With the support of 13 external experts and 5 professionals from our institutions, PAIIES was implemented in three phases:

- Understanding the cultural context.
- Intercultural training and sensitization.
- Networking experience.

The training was designed to promote ongoing reflection on the contributions of interculturality and the development of networks, impacting 26 administrative staff of the three universities from different administrative areas.
